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AIC ties up with five local polytechnics to boost volunteerism and professional exposure for students

The Agency for Integrated Care (AIC) has established partnerships with each of the five local polytechnics to expand volunteering opportunities in the Community Care sector for students. Through curated volunteering programmes, AIC will open up opportunities for students of each polytechnic to deepen their knowledge on ageing and apply their classroom learnings to real-world experiences.

- 2. The inking of the five Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) took place this morning. The signatories involved are Mr Tan Kwang Cheak, Chief Executive Officer (CEO) of AIC, and the Principal & CEO (PCEOs) or Deputy Principals of each of the five polytechnics. They are Ms Loh Chuu Yi of Nanyang Polytechnic, Mr Lim Kok Kiang of Ngee Ann Polytechnic, Ms Jeanne Liew of Republic Polytechnic, Mr Loh Yew Chiong of Singapore Polytechnic, and Mr Peter Lam of Temasek Polytechnic.
- 3. The signing ceremony was witnessed by Minister for Health Mr Ong Ye Kung, who attended the event as the Guest-of-Honour.

From classroom to real-world

- 4. Over the years, the five polytechnics have been grooming professionals for the healthcare and Community Care sectors through their academic courses in the areas of Social Sciences, Social Work, Gerontology, and Sports & Health. As many of these students go on to specialise in the holistic management of ageing, where they plan practical programmes for seniors and mobilise resources to support older adults with diverse needs, they would benefit from additional avenues to further equip them with hands-on experience in working with seniors.
- 5. The new agreements signed would facilitate this through volunteering opportunities with AIC. During the sessions, students from these courses can expect practical, first-hand exposure to what they have learned in the classrooms. Such experiences will encourage a spirit of volunteerism among students, and their contribution to the Community Care sector.

Benefits of student volunteerism

- 6. As part of the MOU, AIC will make volunteering opportunities in Community Care settings available to students across different specialisations and year of study. These opportunities include volunteering at Active Ageing Centres (AACs) and participating in the Silver Generation Ambassador (SGA) programme, which involves volunteers who engage seniors in their homes on behalf of the Silver Generation Office (SGO), the outreach arm of AIC. Students who join these programmes will be equipped with the necessary knowledge and skills required to engage with seniors in the community.
- 7. As part of the volunteering programmes at AACs, students will befriend seniors and learn how to support those who are at risk of social isolation via student-led activities designed to engage seniors. Through these experiences, intergenerational bonding can be fostered, allowing the students and seniors to better understand and appreciate each other's role in the community. Feedback from the student volunteers will be collected and used in the refinement of programmes for future participants, with the goal of developing a formalised programme that benefits both students and seniors in the long run.
- 8. For students who join the SGA programme, they will be part of teams that conduct home visits to seniors living in the community. During these home visits, SGAs share relevant government schemes and policies, as well as activities and services available, to seniors. These engagements will not only offer students a better understanding of the aspirations and needs of the seniors in the community, but also provide them the option of immersing themselves deeper into the volunteer network for deeper sector training via internships. Students could also choose to tap on the SGA programme in real-time, to support their coursework requirements.

- 9. Mr Sng Hock Lin, Chief of SGO, said, "Today marks a milestone in our quest to boost volunteerism among Singaporeans. We are grateful that the five polytechnics share our vision and have joined us in our journey towards developing a sustainable system that can support our population's ageing trajectory. We welcome more likeminded organisations to work with us in supporting our seniors to live well and age gracefully."
